We promote Keithcot Farm as a school where we develop Respectful, Collaborative, Powerful Learners.

To enable us to be successful in that goal, student wellbeing needs to be supported. In the last newsletter, I talked about our students having low wellbeing in the areas of emotional wellbeing and worries.

On our Pupil Free Day, teachers worked on strategies for addressing this.

The staff worked on implementing the Personal and Social Capabilities into their curriculum planning which will support students to;

- Understand themselves and others, and manage their relationships, lives, work and learning more effectively
- Recognise and regulate emotions
- Develop empathy for others and understanding relationships
- Establish and build positive relationships
- Make responsible decisions
- Work effectively in teams
- Handle challenging situations constructively and develop leadership skills.

We are also working towards implementing a program called 'Zones of Regulation' which will provide us with a framework and common language to teach students how to;

- Identify their feelings
- Understand their feelings in context
- Develop effective regulation tools
- Identify positive solutions to problems

We will provide further information for our school community as we go on this wellbeing journey.
