Learning Culture at Keithcot Farm

_As we approach the end of the term, it is a very busy time around the school. Our focus on quality learning continues right up until the final bell of the final day. We are proud of our learning culture at Keithcot and it's not only the students who have been learning lots this term.

Teachers are using a new phonics and spelling scope and sequence published by the education department and this has been a lot of new learning for us. This term we have used Week 0 and staff meeting time to continue to upskill teachers with this, as well as provide time for review and consolidation of this new learning. In our <u>pupil</u> <u>free day on Thursday next week</u> all staff will be working together to develop capacity and skills in behaviour management.

We are all learners at Keithcot, and learning is at the centre of everything we do. Our core business. This is who we are and what we are all about.


NEW ENROLMENTS AND SCHOOL TOURS AVAILABLE
