





## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### Dear families,

It's hard to believe that this is the last newsletter article that I will write this year. Reflecting on my first year at Keithcot Farm, it has certainly gone very quickly. I have certainly learnt a lot, but that is why I'm here – to grow and develop the school as well as myself. Looking back, we've made some very good progress this year and managed to continue to change and improve the school. This will continue next year; my vision is for Keithcot Farm to maintain and build our high standards, and continue to nuture what is already a fantastic school community.

#### 2025 Classes

Staffing for 2025 is almost finalised and you will be informed of your child's class teacher and classroom location on Friday of Week 9. Students will also have the opportunity to visit their new classes on this day and meet their new teacher. We will start next year with 13 classes, with a mid-year reception class again starting in July.

The process to construct classes is a highly complex task and requires a lot of thought and consideration. The decisions about the organisation of classes within the school, including the year levels in each class, the location of classes, and the teacher/s and students within these classes are made professionally by teachers and our school leadership team. We request the cooperation and understanding of our families as these very important decisions are made.

#### **Staffing Update**

The end of the year is stressful and uncertain time for many staff – especially Contract Teachers and SSOs. The process around staffing is complex and is dependent on student numbers, planned class structures and funding. We will share our staff and classroom structure for the whole school in January as part of a 2025 welcome communication.

One piece of staffing news that I am delighted to share again with you is that Travis Braithwaite has been appointed principal of Tea Tree Gully Primary School for Term 1 2025. Congratulations, too, to Amy Gray who will be stepping into his sizeable size 12 shoes!


